

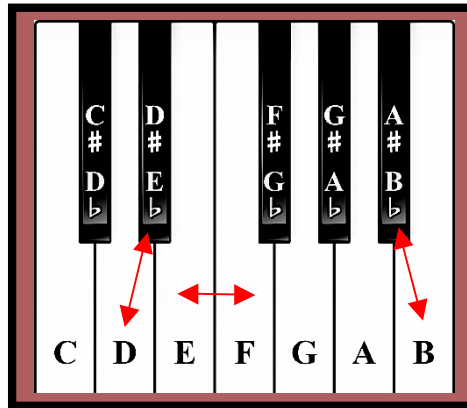
FLATS AND SHARPS

The black piano keys are called flats and sharps. A flat lowers a key a **half step down** to the left, and a sharp raises a key a **half step up** to the right. A half step is the very next note, white or black, up or down, from any given key, as indicated on the keyboard below:



EACH BLACK KEY HAS A FLAT NAME AND A SHARP NAME

The red arrows indicate **half steps**
